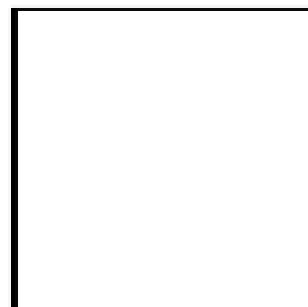
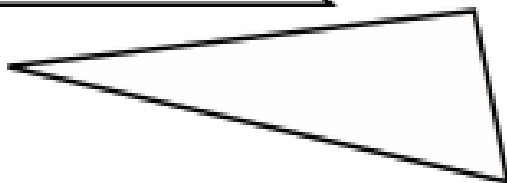
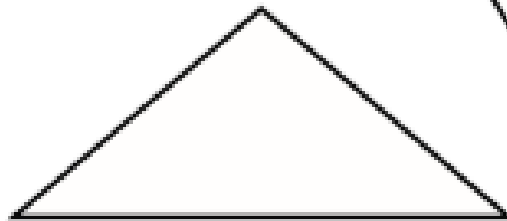
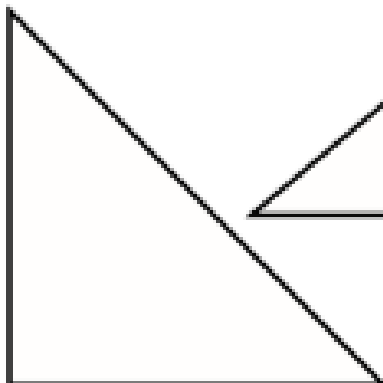
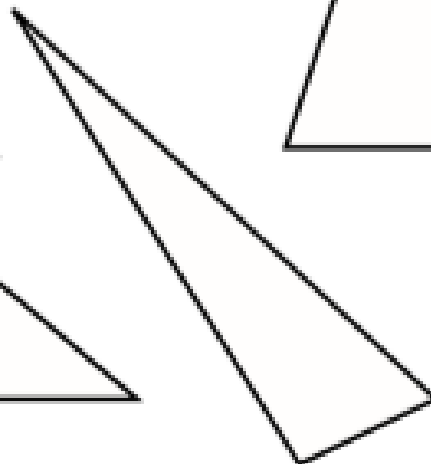
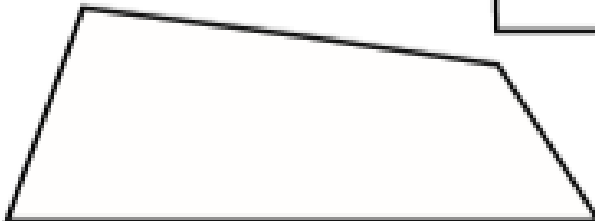
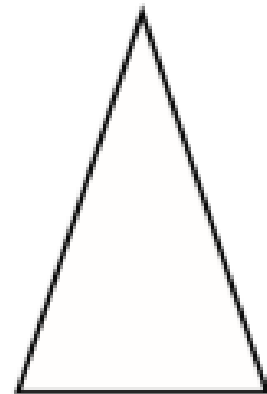
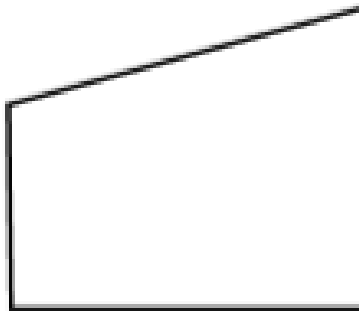
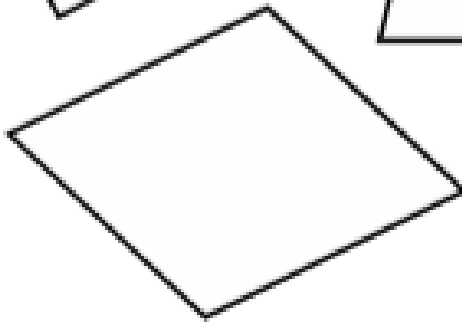
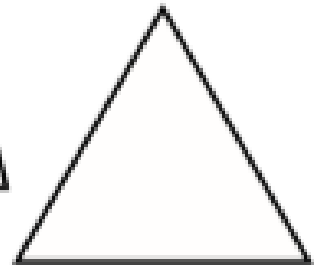
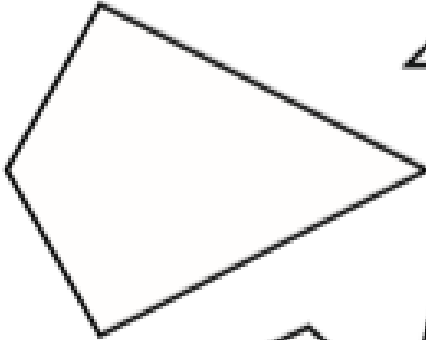
Task 3 – Reading
